

### Where have you laid Him?

ometimes, seemingly insignificant things that happen to us can later trigger things with significant meaning. This happened to me a few years ago. Our neighborhood had a softball team for a few years, and players would come and go. We were practicing one day, and there was a new guy who had shown up. I didn't catch his name while we were on the field, so later in the dugout I went up and said, "Hey, I'm Alan, I didn't catch your name." His response to me was, "Mr. Alan, it's me... Cameron!"

Sure enough, it was Cameron! A kid who lived on my street I hadn't seen in a few years, about 20 years old now, taller than me. But when he spoke those words to me, I immediately recognized his face and voice! I didn't think about it at the time, but now, whenever I think back on this moment, it reminds me of John 20:11-16 where Mary Magdalene has returned to Jesus' tomb early in the morning and sees that He is gone. Jesus has, of course, risen from the dead and is there in the area with her. He says to her in what I can only interpret as a serious yet playful way, "Woman, why are you crying?" Serious, because He had already foretold His return. Somewhat playful, I think, because he knows she is about to

realize it is Him. She tells Him someone must have taken the body and wants to know where they have put it. He then speaks just one more word to her, her name, and she immediately realizes this is the resurrected Jesus. I can only imagine the despair she was feeling the moment right before she realized Jesus was alive. It had been a rough three days, and with this last straw of Jesus' body seemingly being stolen, all of her hope was gone at that moment. Equally difficult to imagine was the level to which it was restored at that particular moment when she realized Jesus was not misplaced or dead but had in fact risen from the dead! In her darkest of times, Jesus was (physically) with her. When you are going through a dark time in your life, remember, Jesus is with you too!

It's hard to completely empathize with what Jesus' original followers were going through on that first Easter weekend since we know the outcome, but I think to a large extent, the feelings we experience on Easter depend on our answer to the question: "Where have YOU laid Him?" Have you put up a tombstone in your heart with Jesus' name on it or is He living inside your heart daily? Easter is a perfect time to reaffirm Jesus is living, inside your heart or to invite Him in for the first time by praying the sinner's prayer:

#### Dear Lord Jesus,

I know I am a sinner, and I ask for Your forgiveness. I believe You died for my sins and rose from the dead. I turn from my sins and invite You to come into



my heart and life. I want to trust and follow You as my Lord and Savior. Amen.

Don't delay! Easter is the anniversary of the resurrection, but you can experience it all year long!
