No Resolution Needed to Follow Jesus!

It's that time of year again where we talk about new beginnings and New Year's resolutions. Some of the common ones, of course, are exercising more, losing weight, and maybe even going to church more often. One thing all of these, and most resolutions, have in common is there is really no need to wait until the new year to start them. You could have gotten on that treadmill in December or not eaten another one of those no-bake cookies (I love no-bake cookies) at any time. You don't have to wait for any certain date to come to church either!

In Matthew 4:18-20, Jesus told Peter and Andrew to follow Him, and it says they did so "at once." They didn't wait until January 1st, the next month, or even the next day — they followed him "at once." In Matthew 8:21-22, a disciple wanted to bury his father before following Jesus, but Jesus told this man to follow Him immediately and let the dead bury their own dead. These are much more extreme examples of commitment than what most of us make as New Year's resolutions, but the point is that there

make me an instrument of your peace." This is a prayer God will always answer. Why?

God works through us. God does not manifest himself in a physical presence in today's world, nor does he alter the natural events of his creation to reveal himself. He reveals himself most profoundly through us, his children, as we become instruments of his will. There are many examples of this in the Bible, such as God's calling Moses to lead the captives from Egypt, God's instructing Samuel to anoint David as King and even Jesus' committing his work to an ordinary and fully human band of followers. God does his work through us.

One morning I received a telephone call from a person in deep distress. I did not know him. He called the church where I was working because someone had sent him information about the church and invited him to be his guest. He found the brochure in a stack of old mail. He found the name and phone number of the church during a moment of emotional distress in his life. That was not a mere coincidence. Someone in the church sent a note in which he shared information about the church and God used that person as an instrument of his mission and purpose.

Pray this prayer asking God to make you his instrument and see what happens. Don't pray the prayer

without sincerity and be ready for action because God will send someone into your life who needs help. Offer the prayer; expect God to use you and then tell me how he used you. I'm looking for stories to share in the spring as we prepare for Easter. This can be part of your journey in the new year. Pray for God to use you and then expect him to come calling on you through a person



on you through a person in need.
